

Outreach 1 Findings Listening Session 35+ in English

- Oakridge and Florence residents attended in significant numbers and advocated for additional services.
- Blue River, Marcola, Cottage Grove, Creswell, Veneta, and Triangle Lake areas were also referenced as needing additional services.
- For Blue River, frequency was ok but timeframes need adjustment.
- Oakridge residents would like to benefit from the LTD pass programs, and get an Amtrak stop.

Outreach 1 Findings 100+ survey responses

- More frequent service: early/late in day
- Additional routes/services within communities: Oakridge & Florence; on-demand
- Airport service and space for luggage
- Pet policies: more flexibility/options
- **Revised LTD fare policies** for Diamond Express
- Access to health care in Eugene/Springfield
- **Bicycle capacity** on transit, bike storage at stops
- Bus stop improvements; covered, signage

Outreach 1 Findings Listening Session 7+ in Spanish

- On-demand services needed for emergency situations
- Improved evening service to attend school events
- More weekend service to experience nature in rural areas
- Host input meetings in-person, in the evenings
- Improve safety and comfort at bus stops
- Improve the process of submitting a transit concern

Innovative Ideas

- Fort Erie (Canada): local on-demand service in a small city and surrounding rural areas, replacing its underperforming fixed-route
- Winnebago County (WI): volunteer-based ride service to provide low-income workers access to jobs
- **RideSource (OR): rural dial-a-ride** in Washington County outside of the TriMet area via its own drivers and lending vehicles to senior centers, health and human services orgs, etc.

Innovative Ideas

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Trade-off 1

Which option would better serve community needs?

- 1. Serves more locations but may have less frequent service
- 2. More frequent service but that may serve fewer locations

Trade-off 2

Which option would better serve community needs?
1. Cheaper rides (ex. \$5) but the bus stop may be further from where I am trying to go

2. Bus stops closer to where I am trying to go but may be more expensive (ex. \$10)

Trade-off 3

Using a **shared ride service**, which option would better serve your needs?

- 1. Pay less (\$5) to connect to a fixed-route bus and continue on to your destination
- 2. Pay more (\$15) and be taken directly to your destination
